## Art 1 ( 1 of 1)

### Course Description:

Art Grade 1 (1 of 1) explores the basic tools, elements, and principles of visual art. The course explores art forms such as drawing, painting, sculpture, and photography. Topics include lines, shapes, patterns, color, texture, balance, imagery, symbols, and subject matter. In addition to examining how visual art can represent a culture, the course explores why artworks and museums are important to the community. The course concludes with critiquing visual artworks and determining what gives art value.

### Course Objectives:

- Describe drawing, painting, sculpting, and photography as forms of visual art.
- Identify tools, materials, and safety practices used to create artwork.
- Identify different lines, shapes, and patterns in artwork.
- Identify primary colors, and mix them to create new colors.
- Explain how emphasis is created in artwork.
- Describe real and imaginary subject matter and natural and human-made environments in art.
- Create paintings with real and imaginary subject matter and natural and human-made environments.
- Create and describe balance in artwork.
- Create sculptures and texture in artworks using different materials.
- Create artwork with imagery and symbols to express personal thoughts and feelings.
- Create a draft and a finished artwork based on observation and personal routines, activities, or environments.
- Describe different types of artwork displayed at home, in school, and in the community.
- Create artworks representing home, school, and community.
- Describe the purpose of art museums and the roles and responsibilities of museum workers and visitors.
- Create a portfolio by saving personal artworks.
- Describe cultural artworks and the different cultural approaches to artmaking.
- Create an artifact that represents a culture, and list the steps taken to create it.
- State opinions and preferences for artworks.
- Revise an artwork using different materials or techniques.
- Create personal artworks using design principles and art elements.
