

Course Description:

Social Studies 5 (1 of 2) examines the history of the United States from pre-Columbian times to 1824. Topics include the history of early Western cultures such as the Maya, Incas, Aztecs, and indigenous cultures in America; some history of Eastern cultures, Africa, and Europe; European contact and colonization of the Americas; the British American colonies; the contributions of various peoples to the United States; and the revolt of the colonies and formation of the United States. There is a research project that examines the founding and religion of one of the British colonies in America.

Course Objectives:

- Explain, compare, and contrast the history, politics, culture, and life of early civilizations in Western culture.
- Describe and explain details about early Eastern cultures and societies, including Asian trade routes, religious reformations, and European explorations and conquests.
- Identify significant individuals in Africa and Europe and explain their contributions to society.
- Identify and explain the impact and contributions of Christopher Columbus and Spanish explorers as they voyaged to the Americas and Mexico.
- Describe and explain interactions between European explorers and indigenous populations in pre-colonial America, including moments of both cooperation and conflict.
- Describe and explain the founding and history of early English colonies, including Jamestown and Plymouth.
- Use primary and secondary sources to research history and answer questions about the past.
- Describe and explain religions and beliefs and economic systems in the colonies.
- Identify and explain details about immigration, migration, social organization, and settlement patterns in seventeenth-century America.
- Identify and explain the contributions of Native Americans, religious innovators, and political, cultural, and commercial leaders to United States history.
- Identify and explain the causes and effects and major events of the French and Indian War and the Revolutionary War.
- Identify and explain the social conflict in the colonies that led to rebellion against England and the creation of the Articles of Confederation.
- Create a presentation about an American colony, with relevant details and illustrations.
