

Course Description:

Social Studies 1 (2 of 2) examines the various features, symbols, holidays, leaders of the United States, as well as describing important people of the past. Activities include identifying national, state, and local government leaders and exploring how local government makes and enforces laws. The impact of resources and the environment are explored in terms of how humans live.

Course Objectives:

- Compare how the things people do affect the Earth and how we live, now and in the past.
- Compare the lives of people from the past who did important things in the US.
- Make and use graphs to learn about them.
- Tell how families are the same and different in how they meet their basic needs.
- Tell what people need to know and do to make things and give services in your city.
- Tell how and why goods, ideas, and people move from place to place.
- Tell how good ideas about new things can make your life and city better, using older and newer sources.
- Talk about how the things you need and want help you make choices.
- Talk about flags and other symbols like the Statue of Liberty that are special to our state and country.
- Say what people do if they work for your city's government.
- Talk about how people make and use things in your city.
- Ask questions about people who made big changes in the world.
- Know what kinds of weather your city has each year and how it changes how you live.
